1. Title

National Youth Science Forum Commitment to Child Safety (Commitment to Child Safety).

2. Purpose

The purpose of this Commitment to Child Safety is to make a public statement declaring National Youth Science Forum's (NYSF) commitment to child safety.

This Commitment to Child Safety applies to all NYSF staff, directors, contractors, volunteers, NYSF program and event participants, and NYSF program and event content providers, who work with or have contact with children and young people.

4. Commitment to Child Safety

- 1. NYSF is committed to providing children and young people with a safe and nurturing environment in which they can learn and thrive.
- 2. NYSF supports, values and respects all children and young people, and is committed to their safety, privacy, participation and empowerment.
- 3. NYSF has zero tolerance for all forms of child abuse or risk of harm against children and young people, and all concerns, reports and allegations will be taken seriously and responded to promptly and thoroughly in accordance with our policies and procedures.
